SHORT EXAMPLE OF APA RULES (6th Edition)

The author or authors of the article will be responsible for the accuracy of bibliographic citations and references.

1. Citations in the Text

- If the sentence includes the author's surname, follow this with the date only between parentheses: Surname (year)
- If the author's name is not given in the sentence, write the author's surname and the date between parentheses: (Surname, year)
If the work has more than two authors, give all authors' surnames in the first citation:
Surnames, Surnames and Surnames, year
In all following citations, give only the first author's surname, followed by the phrase 'et al.':
Surnames et al. (year)
If there are more than six authors, use the 'et al.' format in the first citation as well.
- Reference to different works in the same citation:
(Surname Author1, Surname Author2 and Surname Author3, year; Surname Author1, Surname Author2 and Surname Author3, year)
- Quotations within the text:
 - Quotations up to 40 words long:
Surname (year): 'quotation' (p. xx)
'quotation' (Surname, year, p. xx)
 - Quotations more than 40 words long:
Surname (year):
(1 space)
... quotation
xx
xx
xx (p. xx).
(1 space)
- All citations within the text must be reflected in the 'Bibliographic References' section or the 'Electronic Sources' section.

2. Bibliographic References

- Include only the sources on which the research is based in 'Bibliographic References'. Do not include sources used to gain a more-thorough understanding of the subject.
- Place references in alphabetical order with a hanging indent (1.25).
- Give the name of the responsible author at the head of the reference in small caps (Make the first letter a capital letter and write the rest in lower case; then apply the 'small caps' font format): Surname Surname, A. A.
- Place works by the same author in chronological order. If any works by the same author share the same year of publication as well, differentiate between them by adding a letter in cursive (*a*, *b*, etc.) after the year:
Surname, A. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.
— (year *a*): *Title*. City: Publisher.
— (year *b*): *Title*. City: Publisher.
- If the document has a DOI (Digital Object Identifier), give the DOI at the end of the reference:
Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher. doi: xxxxxxxx
- In electronic documents:
 - Do not include the name of the database except in the case of electronic books, theses or dissertations.

- In the appropriate reference for the type of document, add 'Recovered from <http://xxxxx>', without the consultation date, and then give the DOI, if there is one:

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher. doi: xxxxxxxx. Recovered from <http://xxxxx>

2.1. Books

Complete Books:

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.

- Book with an editor/editors or coordinator/coordinators:
Surname Surname, A. A. (Ed.). (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.
Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A. (Coords.). (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.

- Book with several authors. Give no more than six authors:
Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A. and Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.
Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A., Surname Surname, A. A. et al. (year). *Title*. City: Publisher.

Chapter of a Book:

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). Title of the Chapter. In A. A. Surname Surname (Ed.), *Title of the Book* (pp. xx-xx). City: Publisher.

2.2. Articles in Periodicals

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). Title of the Article. *Title of the Publication*, vol., No., pp. xx-xx.

2.3. Addresses, Conferences, Lectures and Seminars

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title of the Lecture*. Name of the Conference, City, days XX-XX month.

2.4. Theses and Dissertations

Surname Surname, A. A. (year). *Title*. (Unpublished master's thesis or doctoral dissertation). Name of the institution, location.
